4. When is the deadline for Homestead Property Tax Refund?

Senior Citizens' Utility Tax Rebate Program Deadline March 31

To qualify for the refund, ALL THREE of the following must apply:

- Resident of Kansas City, KS;
- 2. 65 years of age or older during the entire 2020 calendar year;
- Gross household income does not exceed \$25,000.

You need the following information to apply:

- Name
- Last four digits of your social security number
- Mailing address
- Date of birth
- Telephone number
- Copy of your 2020 gas, BPU and phone bills
- Proof of 2020 income (social security, pensions, disability, W2 tax reports, interest, etc.) including
 your spouse's income.

Submit your information today via mail, fax or in person. All applications must be received or postmarked by March 31, 2021.

Homestead Property Tax Refund Deadline April 15

If you were a Kansas resident for all of 2020 and owned and occupied a homestead, you are eligible for a refund of \$700 if your total household income is \$36,000 or less, AND you:

- were born before January 1, 1965; OR
- were totally and permanently disabled or blind for the entire year of 2020; OR
- have a dependent child who lived with you the entire year that was born before January 1, 2020 and was under the age of 18 for all of 2020; OR,
- are a disabled veteran (50% or more) or the surviving spouse of a disabled veteran who has not remarried, or the surviving spouse of an active duty military personnel who died in the line of duty and not remarried.

Household income is generally all taxable and non-taxable income received by all members of the household. You can complete a Form K-40H electronically or have our Clerk's Office help you complete the required documentation.

COVID 19 INFORMATION

Seniors in Wyandotte County who want to be vaccinated must fill out the UGPHD's Vaccine Interest Form. The survey can be found online at ughealth.info/vaccine, or by going to wycokck.org/COVID-19 and clicking on COVID-19 Vaccines. From there, click on the large button that says "Fill Out the Vaccine Interest Form". The form is available in both English and Spanish. For those without an internet connection, please call 3-1-1 for assistance in filling out the form. Once you have filled out the form, you'll receive updates as to when you are eligible for a vaccine, how to make an appointment, etc.

New Vaccination and Testing Site Now Open A mass vaccination facility near the Legends is now open in Western Wyandotte County, in addition to the central location at 78th and State Ave. Both of these mass vaccination sites offer vaccines by appointment only, Monday - Friday, 9 AM - 3 PM. They also offer saliva testing kits, which are available Monday - Friday, 9 AM - 3 PM, on a walk-in basis.


